On 4 August 2018 Naipunnyans gave a helping hand to Mr. Jinshad, a young man who was paralyzed after a tragic accident by donating an automatic wheelchair.

As a part of furthering the movement NANMA, students and parents are involved in various humanitarian activities. This year an amount of Rs. 1,75,000 has been collected for the flood victims in Kerala. So also provisions and clothes were collected and contributed to ANBODU Kochi at Regional Sports Centre Kadavanthara on 14th August 2018.







Nothing demonstrates the compassionate heart of Naipunnyans better than the amazing response to the August flood disaster. Floods wrecked havoc on the lives of thousands of people across Kerala. Naipunyans rose to the occasion and immediately formed a rescue committee under the leadership of Executive Director Rev. Fr.Paul Meledath.The PTWA, teachers and students sprung into action with the evacuation of more than 700 affected people from flood hit areas. Immediate supply of food, medicines and clothes to the victims were undertaken.The relief camp started on 16 August and continued till 24 August. Each day started with breakfast, lunch and dinner which were provided by the Navy. In addition food items were prepared under the leadership of Rev. Fr. Joseph Parecattil and his parish members. A full fledged 24 hours medical camp ensured that the victims were free of sickness and trauma. Student volunteers and PTWA members along with the teachers worked round the clock to ensure that the victims had a home like experience. As batches of people left for their home they were given kits which comprised of clothes, food, medicines and cleaning materials. The hospitality and compassion of the Naipunnyas were evident when the victims left the camp with gratitude filled hearts. The school also contributed to the cleaning mission by providing the school buses which transported volunteers to different areas for the cleaning work.



SARGOTSAV - the literary and cultural fest, held on 21st July 2018 showcased vibrant, contagious and exuberant Naipunnyans. The day when the students got a break from their busy schedule of academics and involved themselves in celebration of arts, thus fashioning a world with human qualities.
